Forces and Magnets

* compare how things move on different surfaces *notice that some forces need contact between 2 objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance * observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others * compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify some magnetic materials * describe magnets as having 2 poles *predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing

Place Value – Numbers to 1000 Addition and Subtraction - * add and subtract numbers mentally, including: a three-digit number and 1s, a three-digit number and 10s, a three-digit number and 100s * add and subtract numbers with up to 3 digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction (no carrying/exchanging) Multiplication and Division -* recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables * write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know
