Animals

Science

- * identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat
- * identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement

Maths

Multiplication and Division -* recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables * write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know. **Fractions**-recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a set of objects or quantity. * write simple fractions, for example $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3. * recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and $\frac{1}{2}$ * count up and down in tenths; recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts and in dividing one-digit numbers or quantities by 1 * understand that fractions can be added together to make a whole (bar model examples) and also show using missing fraction sentences (1/5 + ? = 1) * recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators. **Measure** – **lengths** * measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm) **Measure** – **perimeter** * measure the perimeter of simple 2-D shapes
